I am the President of Scenic America and, because one of my closest friends lives there, I have had the pleasure of being a frequent visitor to Vista.

I am writing to voice my opposition to the proposal to put up digital billboards along SR-78 on City of Vista property. Please enter my comments into the record.

The proposed digital billboards will have a detrimental impact on the environment, driver safety and aesthetics.

In addition there is a negative economic impact. A Philadelphia Report entitled "Beyond Aesthetics" found that all properties located within 500 feet of any billboard were valued at 31,000 less ( Beyond Aesthetics: The Economic Impact of Digital Signs).

At a time when municipalities are trying to reduce energy use and carbon production, digital billboards do just the opposite, and disposal will add to electronic waste once the electronic component's 10 year average life span has ended.

Unlike traditional billboards, which are lit by only two or three lamps, and only at night, digital billboards contain from 900 to over 10,000 LED diodes, each using 2 to 10 watts and all of which are illuminated far more during the day than at night.

And LEDs function poorly at high temperatures, so the signs need a cooling system releasing more carbon into the atmosphere as they remove more energy from the grid.

In a report called "Illuminating the Issues": the Environmental Impact of Digital Signs", the author. Greg Young found that " in a year, a digital billboard can consume up to 30 times the energy that an average American home uses."

In addition to its extremely high energy use, there are driver safety issues that have not been properly considered. A growing number of well documented, safety studies regarding the negative impact of digital signage on driver distraction are available.

The National Cooperative Highway Research Program (NCHRP) and the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) published a report that provides a comprehensive review of all prior research studies that have addressed driver distraction and digital billboards, which includes a severe criticism and refutation of industry sponsored studies claiming no impact of driver crashes and digital billboards. In the AASHTO report "Safety Impacts of the Emerging Digital Display Technology for Outdoor Advertising Signs" the author, Jerry Wachtel, found that "nearly every empirical study undertaken since 1995...has demonstrated that there IS an adverse relationship between distraction and digital signs."

The 100 Car Naturalistic Driver Study, found that any source of distraction that removed the driver's eyes from the road ahead for more than two seconds greatly increased the risk

of a crash or near-crash. Nearly 80 percent of all crashes and 65 percent of all near-crashes involved such driver inattention within 3 seconds of the incident. A recently completed pilot study in Sweden found that drivers glanced longer and more frequently at digital billboards, resulting in Government's decision to remove of all digital billboards.

Other issues to consider are the impact on residential quality of Life. The bright, flashing advertising messages are a nuisance and destroy the tranquility of residents who must live under the glare caused by having these nuisance billboards within view of their homes.

Finally, there are future costs to taxpayers when digital billboards need to be removed due to road expansions that require condemnation. The State of Minnesota's DOT recently removed a digital billboard owned by Clear Channel to allow for roadway expansion. The state reimbursed the sign company for \$500,000. Clear Channel contends that the value of the sign is far greater and includes lost revenues. The billboard company has filed a lawsuit for \$5 million.

Whatever revenue the City of Vista might receive from putting up digital billboards it does not offset their negative impact on driver safety, energy consumption and quality of life. The draft IS/MND must be revised to take into account these significant environmental impacts. And, weighing the negative impacts will abandon the plan to erect these signs.
